Dove Bradshaw's quirky porcelain sculptures reveal a distinctly personal approach unallied with any aesthetic school. His (sic.) line-up of "chairs" with pinched legs variously posed along one edge of an elliptical porcelain "floor" makes of these miniature four-legged creatures a study in individual skeletal postures. This is a delicately witty anthropomorphism.
